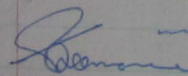

- 1 The minutes of the last meeting were read by the Clerk. On the proposition by Mr Pearson, seconded by Mr Sands, which was carried, they were signed by the Chairman.
- 2 The Chairman spoke for the meeting when he regretted the death of the Clerk, Mr R. Dowling. He mentioned the long and devoted service of Mr Dowling to the village and felt that he would be greatly missed, particularly by the council, for whom he ~~was~~ had been Clerk since 1949. After some discussion, it was proposed by Mr Sands and seconded by Lt. Colonel Bailey that the Chairman approach Mrs Parsons of Moorston with ~~her~~ a view to her filling the post.
- 3 The Precept was signed by Mr Pearson and Lt. Col. Bailey.

- 4 The Chairman read a letter from the WRDC asking for the Council's views concerning the application of Mr Robinson to purchase the allotment. It was felt that the Council's decision at its last meeting, to let the allotment to someone living in the ~~same~~ village, should stand.

It was proposed by Mr Crafer and seconded by Mr Sands that the secretary of the committee be asked to circulate, to members of the Council, the dates of its meetings.
- 7 The Chairman mentioned the subject of a parish notice board. Mr Sands felt that this was essential. Mr Crafer offered to make a small notice board and there was some

After some discussion, during which some doubt was expressed about the ownership and the legal right to sell, it was decided to let Mr Crafer try and get more information on this aspect and also who benefited from the rent.

- 9 Mr Pearson raised the question of the Gravel Pit Hill property and the right of way to it. This he said was choked up and if care was not exercised we might lose the right. The meeting entirely agreed with him and on a proposition by Mr Pearson and seconded by Mr Sands that the legal aspect of ownership and the right of way be clarified and the matter then further considered, was carried.
